Mrs Brookes

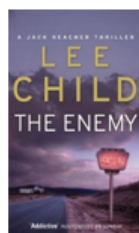
Hotel Avocado: Bob Mortimer

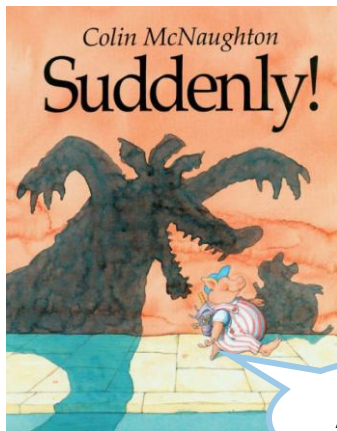

Very good characters and each book in the series reveals new things about each character,



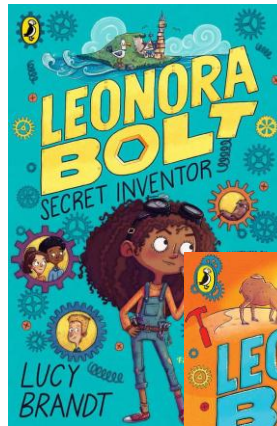

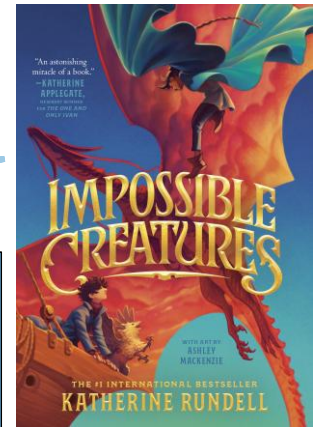
