Online Safety:

It has come to our attention today that there have been some issues around children being part of "chat" groups which have led to conflict or inappropriate behaviour between members of the groups.

I want to be very clear that any "St Teresa groups" are **NOT** official lines of communications from school. These groups can be made up by individual children / groups of children as admin and other children can be added if their phone number is known. This may happen with or without the knowledge of you and your child.

I urge you, as parents and carers, to ensure that any chat groups that your child is part of have been agreed and are monitored by you regularly. If at any time you feel that there is threatening, abusive or inappropriate content in the group, I strongly advise you to make sure your child has removed themselves from the group and has blocked any numbers that are unknown to you. We thank you for your vigilance and alerting us to anything that could be a concern.

Summary:

- Check what groups your child belongs to on any social media platform, including WhatsApp. If in doubt, ask them to leave the group.
- Monitor your child's online activity closely to ensure that they are not being exposed to any inappropriate or abusive behaviour from children either known or unknown to you.
- If you have any concerns about the content of any groups that your child belongs to, contact the Police for serious concerns and come to speak to Mrs Brookes and our safeguarding team in school.

It will always be our priority to keep our school community safe and we have a zero-tolerance policy for any kind of bullying, including cyber bullying.

Thank you in advance for your co-operation in helping to keep our school community safe from online abuse.
