Congratulations to Year 3 for **excellent** attendance this week 99.3%

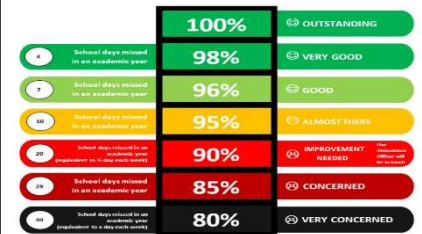
130 pupils achieved 100% attendance this week – keep up the good work!!

Parents Evening – Wednesday 22nd October - This will be the first progress check in with your child's teacher and we encourage as many parents as possible to attend. Appointment letters will be sent home next week. If you would like to make an additional appointment with Mrs Brookes, please ring school to book in advance.

New approach to homework:

Reading: ALL year groups will be bringing a book home to read each week. Reading is the gateway to all other learning, and we ask for your support to encourage our screen loving children to immerse themselves in reading for at least 10 minutes every night. Junior children should be able to read at pace with increasing stamina and regular reading practice at home will be hugely beneficial. It is our aim to revamp our library during the next few months as it is a rich resource for the children to use for books for reading for pleasure. We will have a fluid system of borrowing and returning books one at a time so that there is no limit on how many books children read at home during the week.

Infant children will, of course continue to have a strong focus on phonic knowledge and will bring books home suitably matched to the sounds they know.

Online: Sites such a TT Rock Stars and Spelling Shed help to build vital practice for basic skills and are strongly recommended for regular short burst of learning at home. We will continue to monitor the regular use of these sites.

Independent Learning: We understand the importance of quality family time. We are going to be moving away from a traditional worksheet-based approach this year with the belief that more children will engage with independent home learning when it is rooted in their own interests. We will be introducing opportunities for your child to engage in more detailed topic-based learning during the year , based on their interests and skills from across the curriculum and through a variety of different media – more details to follow shortly!
